- -Attend a munch (casual kink meet-up) in your area
- -Join a virtual Q&A or Domme Roundtable

Ask a question in a safe space-even anonymously

You don't have to be perfect. You just have to be present. Stay Grounded with These Reminders-You are not alone.- You don't need to be a stereotype.- Asking questions is powerful.- You don't have to rush
